The Lighting of the Advent Candles

Hear the word from the Prophet Isaiah: 63:7-9

7I will recount the gracious deeds of the LORD, the praiseworthy acts of the LORD, because of all that the LORD has done for us and the great favor to the house of Israel that he has shown them according to his mercy, according to the abundance of his steadfast love.

8 For he said, "Surely they are my people, children who will not act deceitfully," and he became their savior

9 in all their distress.

It was no messenger or angel but his presence that saved them; in his love and pity it was he who redeemed them; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

The 3 blue candles and the pink candle are lit from the altar candle.

On the first Sunday of Advent we lit the candle of Hope. On the second Sunday we lit the candle of Peace. On the third Sunday we lit the candle of Joy. Today we light the candle of Love. We remember the love we have for family and friends when we remember the Love Joseph and Mary had for their son. But also, when we look at the manger we see the love God has for each one of us. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but will have eternal life." Let us rejoice today in the love we share with family and friends and the love our Father in Heaven shares with us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. ²⁰But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear

a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

²³"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"

which means, "God is with us."²⁴When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, ²⁵but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.
