Hear the word from the Prophet Isaiah: 57:14-19

¹⁴ It shall be said, "Build up, build up, prepare the way; remove every obstruction from my people's way." 15 For thus says the high and lofty one who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place and also with those who are contrite and humble in spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble and to revive the heart of the contrite. ¹⁶ For I will not continually accuse, nor will I always be angry, for then the spirits would grow faint before me, even the souls that I have made. ¹⁷ Because of their wicked covetousness I was angry; I struck them; I hid and was angry, but they kept turning back to their own ways. ¹⁸ I have seen their ways, but I will heal them; I will lead them and repay them with comfort, creating for their mourners the fruit of the lips.^[a] 19 Peace, peace, to the far and the near, says the LORD, and I will heal them.





⁸Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. ⁹The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. ¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.




