Trinity Church Council Actions of Note from Tuesday December 13, 2022 meeting:

- The ad hoc committee for worship scheduling has worked diligently to determine the congregation's preferences. Council approved the committee's recommendation to have one worship each Sunday at 9 am with Sunday School to follow at 10. The change will take effect on January 8, 2023.
- The Nominating Committee presented the slate of candidates for election at the annual meeting.
- The Council approved the hiring of Anthony Maldonado as the part time custodian for Trinity. He will begin after January 1.
- The Council reviewed the proposed 2023 budget and recommended approval by the congregation at the annual meeting.
- The council approved background checks for all persons who have contact with minors at Trinity.

We look ahead:

- The annual meeting will be held at 11 am on Sunday January 29th following Sunday School.
- The February council meeting will be held on the third Tuesday, the 21st. The reason for the change for this one meeting is to accommodate the likelihood of remotely cast ballots from the annual meeting, which take 2 weeks to go out and come back in the mail.

The January Council meeting will he held at 6:30 pm on Tuesday the 10th.

CHANGE TO WORSHIP SCHEDULE

In the October monthly Trinity Tidings, Pastor Jim raised the question whether we should continue with two services or go to one. To address this question, the Church Council formed the Worship Scheduling Team which created a survey to solicit church members' preferences. This survey was included in the November 13th and 20th bulletins. It was also available in a Google Form for the convenience of members who wanted to respond electronically.

We requested that members provide one response per household. The surveys allowed for member comments. We received a total of 97 responses. Eighty-three (86%) were in favor of going to one 9:00 AM service, with Sunday School/4G to follow at 10:00 AM. Fourteen (14%) wanted to continue with the two services. We did receive some comments primarily concerning the impact of the change to 4G and Sunday School attendance. These concerns were addressed with the teachers and the support staff resulting in support for the one service at 9:00 AM followed by Sunday School/4G at 10:00 AM.

The Worship Scheduling Team also considered comments from a variety of individuals both for and against going to one service. Given the overwhelming response for one service, the Team felt it was in the best interest of the Trinity family to move to one service. However, if attendance grows to a level where one service is no longer practicable, the Council will revisit this decision.

In consultation with the teachers and support staff, the Team recommended to begin the one service on Sunday 8 Jan 2023. For continuity purposes, this date was selected because the prior two Sundays (Christmas and New Year's) have one 9:00 AM service.

Everyone's comments or concerns received during this process were prayerfully considered. We wish to thank everyone for being a part of this process and we hope that our Trinity Family continues to grow and prosper in God's name.

In summary, the Church Council has approved beginning on Sunday, 8 Jan we will have one worship service at 9:00 AM followed by Sunday School/4G at 10:00 AM.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR, JIM SCAIFE



Over the last few months these articles have focused on the "5 Guiding Lights. (See next page)". In Christian Spirituality this is a common process for decision making whether it be for an individual or a Christian community. As Christians we all long to bring God into our decisions, but it is not always easy to find God's direction. God seldom gives anyone a blinding flash that lays out an entire course of action.

However, according to this process, God "lights" the way through prayer, Scripture, circumstances, judgement and counsel. These five lights are all seen in Acts 15. Early church leaders used them to help them with a crucial decision for the infant church. They also fit well with the journey of the Wisemen who followed the light of the star but did not know their final destination.

We have already considered the lights of Scripture and prayer as guides to Christian decision making. This month the guiding light is circumstances. You remember the old adage; "when God closes a door, God opens a window. This is an expression of the guiding light of circumstances. Many times the tendency in decision making is to focus on the door that is closed rather than the window that God has opened. Sometimes we even prefer to beat our heads against the closed door rather than hop through the open window right next to it.

Seeing "the window" is not always easy. Reflection on Circumstances is an important exercise. It consists of questions that may seem, at first, silly or obvious. For example: why are we doing this? What do we hope to accomplish? What has led us to this point? What is not working? Who is involved? Who will be affected by the decision we make? These are questions of circumstances. As the answers to these sorts of questions clarify, we see God's direction unfolding.

January 6 is the Day of Epiphany, According to western Church tradition this is the day the wisemen found the baby Jesus. They had been traveling at night, following the star for, perhaps as much as, two years. They first went to the palace to see if the king was there. This made perfect sense, but God closed this door. The king was not in the palace. There was, however, a window open. It led to the stable in Bethlehem and a king greater than any they could have imagined. Circumstances had opened up before them and they found the King of Kings, God's Son, Jesus, lying in a manger.

What wisdom from our education and experience has God given us to face the current situation?

Whispers of the Spirit (vs 28)

When we turn to God in prayer with open, listening hearts, what thoughts and insights come to us for our situation?



STEPHEN MINISTRY UPDATE

The following are the core values identified by the Stephen Leaders for Trinity's Stephen Ministry program.

- 1. <u>A commitment to lay ministry.</u> We believe strongly that the role of pastor, Stephen Leaders, and Stephen Ministers is to "prepare God's people for works of service." (Ephesians 4:12)
- 2. <u>Refuge for the hurting.</u> We want our church to be a place and congregation where hurting people can receive compassion, care, and Christ's healing love.
- 3. <u>Every Christian a minister.</u> All God's people have been blessed with spiritual gifts and God calls us all to active ministry.
- 4. <u>Bear one another's burdens.</u> God does not want any of us to suffer alone, but wants us to love, encourage, and care for one another.
- 5. <u>The spread of the Gospel.</u> Jesus commanded us to seek the salvation of all people through the spreading of the Good News. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19)
- 6. <u>The power of prayer.</u> We believe "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us." (1 John 5:14)
- 7. <u>Fellowship with one another.</u> We believe our faith is strengthened through fellowship with other believers. "That is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. (Romans 1:12)
- 8. <u>Spiritual renewal through Word and Sacrament.</u> God shows His love and mercy for people through His Word and Sacraments and brings healing, forgiveness, wholeness, and restoration through His Son, Jesus Christ.
- 9. <u>Being good stewards of God's gifts.</u> Everything we are and have are gifts from God and should therefore be used to bring glory to God. We use our time and talents for serving our Lord and taking care of God's creation.

If these values are at the center of your faith, I encourage you to consider becoming a Stephen Leader. Without at least two new Stephen Leaders our Stephen Ministry program at Trinity will not be able to continue. New Stephen Leaders are trained through the Bridge Leader's Training Course which is done online. Skills are taught through a variety of teaching and learning methods – including presentation, group discussion, video, and skill practice activities – for an engaging, enjoyable, and productive training experience.

Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Where Does My Offering Go?



ELCA members in more than 9,300 congregations in the United States and Caribbean give approximately \$1.75 billion in regular offering to support ELCA ministries in their local communities and worldwide. When members give through their congregations, a percentage of that money is then shared with the local synod and the national churchwide organization.

This unrestricted giving, called Mission Support, gives us both the foundation and the fuel to do God's work in the world and a portion of the gifts circle back to support ministries in synods and local congregations. Of these unrestricted gifts, the churchwide organization receives around 2.6 percent. This represents the largest portion of the ELCA churchwide organization's operating budget.
