FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MARK ...



"The days are surely coming . . ."

This coming Sunday, November 28, is the first Sunday of the season of Advent. This is the season of watching and waiting for and anticipating the coming of Jesus Christ; savior, Son of God, Immanuel (God with us). Now we know that Christ has already come; born as a babe in a manger in Bethlehem, lived and taught and healed and moved among us; died on a cross in Jerusalem; was raised and now lives forever. But each year, we once again enter into this season, remembering Christ's presence with us, and at the same time hope for that day when he will return, ushering in God's kingdom begun but not yet fully here.

The prophets, especially Jeremiah, spoke of coming days; days in which the Lord would fulfill promises made, days in which God's people would live in safety, and righteousness and justice (see Jeremiah 33).

Coming days when the Lord would "make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt — a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. ³³But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more." (Jeremiah 31.33-34)

And Mary, the mother of God, sings a song of God's presence in the now, and what God will accomplish in Jesus, the Christ Child Mary is bearing:

"My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

⁴⁸for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

⁵⁰His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

⁵¹He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵²He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; ⁵³he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, ⁵⁵according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever." (Luke 1.46-55)

God's love and peace to all of us in the season of waiting and watching for the days that are surely coming!

Trinity Church Council Actions of Note from 3 and 9 November, 2021 meetings.

- With the recommendation of the Return Committee, amended Covid 19 policies were approved at an electronic Council meeting on November 3. The new policy allows both masked, physically distanced in-person, in-house activities and safe in-person electronic participation for those needing or preferring less personal risk of exposure. The Covid new case rate remains extremely high. Some restrictions will remain in place until the rate of new infections fall to more acceptable levels.
- Christin Gasner received council approval as our Digital Communications Coordinator as of November 8. Our prayers are with Christin as she grows into her new responsibilities.
- Planning continues for the annual meeting to be held on January 30, 2022.
 - Committee inputs for the 2022 annual budget will be finalized at the December Council meeting.
 - The nominating committee is beginning the process of finding members for church council and committees, as well as voting delegates to La Crosse Synod and other important ministries. Please contact the office if you are interested in serving.

Building a Culture of Generosity



In the past few weeks, members of Trinity have been returning our Statements of Intent for the *Building a Culture of Generosity effort*. We are certainly witnessing significant generosity from you, in both your intent of giving, and your willingness to be involved in the ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church!

Currently, out of 398 invitations to fill out the intention of giving cards and complete a time and talents survey, we have had 110 responses! **Thank you!**

If you were unable to return your intent card or time and talents survey, there is still time! You can send them by mail, or you can simply email office@tlcsparta.org and your intent will be recorded from the email. If you would like to complete a time and talent survey online, visit our website, www.tlcsparta.org; click on the ministries tab, and find a survey that you can submit.

Please remember that intents are not binding, but are used for us to proclaim our faith, and to help the congregational leadership in making plans for the coming year.

When do you stop giving and growing in giving? You don't. Growth in generosity is a journey.

If your giving is to be blessed and joyful, it must continue to grow and expand. For each person, that growth may look different! Some are motivated by a biblical tithe and then to grow to the concept of offerings. Others seek to grow by a percent a year and never stop their giving. While still others have the challenge to find a process to be more generous even in a case where their income has declined due to layoff, death, or divorce.

In each case, once you have experienced the joy of good and generous giving, you will want to keep on growing!

\$300 Deduction Available

You may not know that there is a special tax advantage this year to encourage giving of at least \$300 to charity. The CARES Act passed by Congress will allow those who do not itemize on their taxes to deduct up to \$300 on your taxes for gifts made to charitable organizations like Trinity Lutheran Church. The deduction is only for gifts of cash made in calendar year 2021.

Many of you have already given more than \$300 and for that we are grateful. For those considering an extra gift to Trinity, we wanted to let you know our plans for what we will do if revenue ends up exceeding expenses this year. With excess funding, we will:

*Continue the repair of the North Wall of the Sanctuary *Provide extra support for our youth going to the ELCA national youth gathering

We are ready to move this ministry forward. Every gift and every giver strengthens our shared ministries to nurture faith, care for our community, and share God's Good News throughout the world. Thank you for giving.

To qualify for the \$300 deduction and to allocate funds as designated above, gifts should be received at the church by December 31, 2021. Send check to Trinity Lutheran Church, 612 N. Of course, you should check with your tax advisor before declaring any gifts to charity on your taxes.

STEPHEN MINISTRY UPDATE

As previously mentioned in the October and November updates, an important part of Stephen Ministry is Peer Supervision. The Stephen Ministers meet twice a month to discuss their caring relationships in a confidential manner and get feedback from on another on ways to improve their caring relationships.



The Stephen Ministers recently completed an evaluation on how the process of peer supervision is going. This is the last article regarding this evaluation and focuses on the response to the following question:

In what ways has your supervision group strengthened your own care giving skills?

Encourages me to learn my Bible verses!

Helps me be more patient.

I see the need for Stephen Ministry everywhere. All are

struggling in their own ways.

I am getting better at active listening.

This group has helped me think of new approaches.

This group has helped my own personal spiritual growth.

In case review, they shared their efforts to relate and they offered me ideas for me to improve.

Helps me understand that sometimes it's not me and to let God be the cure giver.

This group helps redirect and gives assistance when I am questioning the direction my relationship is going with my care receiver.

I usually walk away writing down specific questions to ask my care receiver. The team gives me empathy.

I feel empowered when done, ready to take on the mission.

The discussions about Stephen Ministers' experiences with their care receivers have provided me with ideas about approaching my current care receiver.

The responses reveal how vital Peer Supervision is to the success of our Stephen Ministry. Trinity has a strong team of Stephen Ministers helping people who are going through difficult times in their lives. We thank God for this ministry and pray for its continued growth.







MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND

Your Trinity Mission Endowment Fund at Work

The Trinity Mission Endowment Fund was established to provide an ongoing means of supporting the activities of Trinity Lutheran Church. The only funds that the Mission Endowment Fund has to work with are those that are given specifically to the Fund through Memorials, Gifts or Bequeaths of Estates. These funds are held in a local bank account until we have sufficient funds to invest in stock in the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. Each quarter of the year we receive a dividend somewhere in the area of \$500 to \$600 depending on the value of the stock at the time. This year, the stock Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA has done well. Current value of the stock held is around \$66,000. Obviously, if we had more money in the Fund we would reap larger dividends and be able to do more with the proceeds.

Each year the Trinity Mission Endowment Fund must disperse most of the income from these invested funds; and we are required to distribute the money among the youth, the community, the larger work of the Church in the World and for unbudgeted projects of Trinity. This year in August we distributed \$250 Scholarships to four of Trinity's seniors heading off to college. At our November meeting we decided to distribute the remaining \$900 in three ways. Sugar Creek Bible Camp, St. Claire Health Mission and Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan (for Afghan resettlement help) will each receive \$300. The Church Council also authorized us to purchase a QuickBooks accounting system with our donation to the unbudgeted item. This program will be used to better keep track of our funds and can be used by other organizations in the church.

We want to thank everyone who has donated to the Mission Investment Fund of Trinity in the past and who continue to do so. Again, when giving a memorial in remembrance of someone, a gift to the church or a bequest of your estate to the church, consider specifying all or part be put in the Endowment Fund. The gift you give to the Fund will continue the legacy of your gift for many years through the distribution of income from the Fund.

May God bless you all with a happy and healthy Christmas season and a most blessed New Year.
